An Associate of Fine Art in Music from State Fair Community College will give you a solid foundation toward completing the final two years of a bachelor's degree at any college or university.

Music offers many career opportunities such as music education (both vocal and instrumental), vocal performance, instrumental performance, conducting, composition, music for worship, music business, music therapy, music technology, the recording industry, the television and radio industry, music librarianship, film scoring, music arts management, or music publishing. - › Voice or instrumental studies with a private instructor for four semesters. This provides one-on-one instruction in developing your talent as you move to the next level. Each student performs on a recital each semester.
- › Piano, either class or applied, for four semesters.

- › Perform with Chamber Choir and/or Jazz Choir and/or Jazz Band and/or Concert Band each semester. Ensembles not only provide performance opportunities but also give students a chance to learn conducting and leadership skills.
- › Four semesters of Music Theory and Aural Training and two semesters of Music History and Literature.

The program offers several performance scholarships to students who wish to participate in SFCC's music ensembles. Students do not have to be music majors or participate in an ensemble to apply for performance scholarships.

Facilities

The Stauffacher Center for the Fine Arts is the heart of arts and entertainment at SFCC. The 40,000-square-foot building was built in 1994 and was made possible by a \$3 million bequest from Dr. and Mrs. C. Gordon Stauffacher. The center boasts a state-of-the-art 240-seat theatre in which plays, concerts and lectures are held throughout the year and is home to fine and performing arts classrooms.

Transfer and Bachelor's Degree Options

SFCC has agreements with many four-year schools that ensure our credits transfer. We have augmented agreements with Central Methodist University (CMU) that provide bachelor's degree programs at SFCC's Sedalia, Clinton, Lake of the Ozarks, and online campuses; University of Central Missouri (UCM) and University of Missouri-Columbia for specific on-ground programs; and Drury University, Grantham University and University of Phoenix for specific online programs. CMU and UCM also offer dual admission through SFCC.

We also have specific reciprocal music agreements with CMU, Drury University and Missouri State University.
