Mason's growing interest in welding and metal art led him to SFCC. "I came across the new Olen Howard Workforce Innovation Center with state-of-the-art welding equipment that kind of drew my attention." Mason took a college visit and ultimately decided he wanted to become a part of the experience.

During his time at SFCC, Mason distinguished himself through academic achievements and as a recycled metal artist, creating unique sculptures from scrap steel and old machine parts. He's connected and built strong relationships with industry-experienced instructors and peers who share his passion for art welding. He even participated in a 12-day trip to a municipal power plant in Ames, Iowa, where he and his classmates worked on a boiler and gained practical experience.

Additionally, Mason successfully sells his art through his online business, Mammoth Metals and attends events like Nuts, Bolts & Thingamajigs, a non-profit foundation that provides scholarships, STEM camps, and grants.

Mason graduated Summa Cum Laude with an Associate of Applied Science, a Professional Certificate in Welding Technology, and a Skills Certificate in Structural Welding with Distinction.

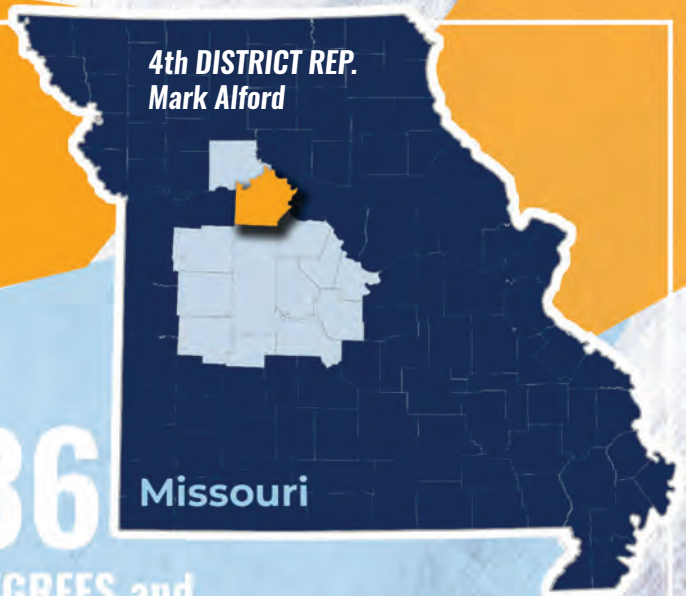

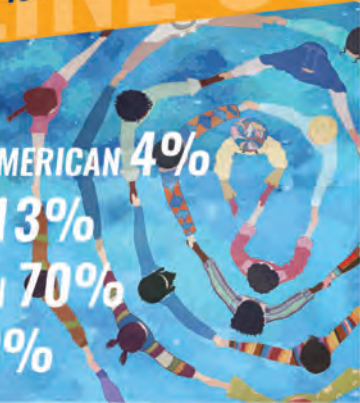

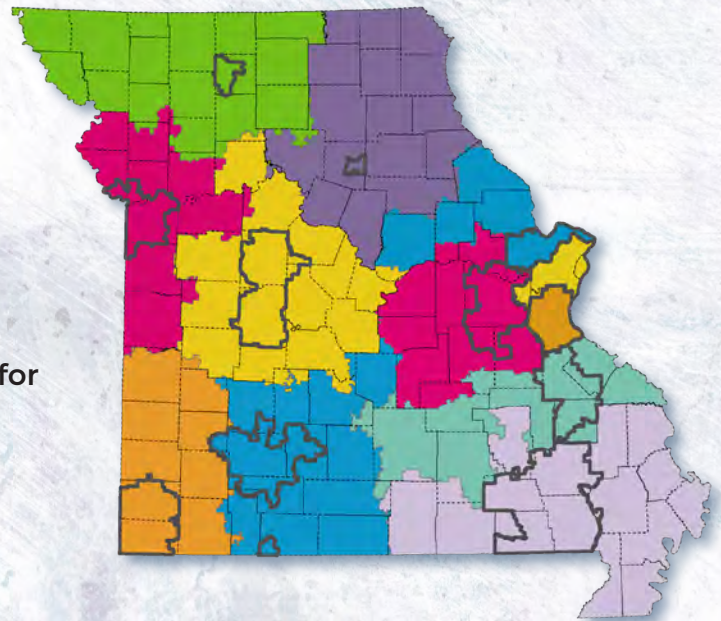
