#### 14. ARPA WORKFORCE TRAINING GRANT (VP Acuff)

The Missouri Department of Economic Development has awarded State Fair Community College \$999,000 through the ARPA Workforce Training Grant Program funded through the American Rescue Plan Act. This grant was awarded to SFCC's Commercial Driving Academy for the purpose of addressing workforce shortages by recruiting and training Missourians in the commercial driving industry. Grant funds must be obligated by December 30, 2024 and utilized by December 30 2026.
